Meeting Agenda & Key Points

Agenda Item 1: Review of previous NPA Report, PVA Meeting Report and action items from report [SEE TRANSCRIPT 09:59]

Maaza Seyoum (African Alliance) asks for feedback on last month's NPA report

- Rachel Nicholson (Amnesty International) finds the reports very useful
- Charles Ebikeme (London School of Economics) agrees that the reports are useful, and suggests adding a "what data are we missing" section to the reports
 - Tian Johnson (African Alliance) agrees with this point and suggests crafting a space within the reports to present information on scheduled, future vaccine delivery

Maaza Seyoum (African Alliance) asks for feedback on last month's PVA meeting report

• The group agrees that these reports (including transcripts) are useful, especially for those who are unable to attend the meetings

Agenda Item 2: PVA Updates [SEE TRANSCRIPT 21:07]

Maaza Seyoum presents are series of updates from the PVA:

- Digital Memorial Wall
 - o Google Form has been sent out
 - Maaza encourages group members to share the form with their network

- PVA hopes to launch the wall on Dec. 8 (one year anniversary of non-trial vaccine delivery in UK)
- <u>Public Citizen</u> (active member of PVA) released a report specific to Pfizer re: importance of pharma accountability
- The group had tentatively planned to collaborate with Christian Aid on Kusi Ideas Festival [SEE TRANSCRIPT 32:48]
 - Robert Mwanyuma has contacts with Nation Media and will follow up.
- Rachel Nicholson suggests planning advocacy action around African Commission on Human and People's Rights (Nov. 15) [SEE TRANSCRIPT 34:17]
 - Tian Johnson responds that the Africa CDC has had this meeting on their radar
- Tian Johnson explains that much of the CDC's focus for December is centered on the Public Health Conference [SEE TRANSCRIPT 36:40]
- Maaza Seyoum reminds group of 3-part webinar (collaboration between African Alliance, Health Justice Initiative, People's Health Movement) focused on vaccine rollout on the continent [SEE TRANSCRIPT 39:50]
 - Maaza invites group to recommend potential speakers for the "Solidarity" panel
 - Charles Ebikeme recommends recruiting researchers for the discussion
 - Rachel Nicholson recommends Livingston Sanjana (Ugandan civil society organizer) as a potential speaker

Agenda Item 3: Tian Johnson presents latest version of Africa Manifesto [SEE TRANSCRIPT 48:06]

- "The intention of the document, really, at the outset was to capture the current moment in the African response, but situated in the historical context."
- About one more week left for final inputs/feedback
- Rachel and Charles commit to reading the document in its entirety and leaving feedback via Google Docs

Agenda Item 4: Updates from the group [SEE TRANSCRIPT 56:15]

Robert Mwanyuma (Christian Aid) presents the following updates from Christian Aid [SEE TRANSCRIPT 47:08]:

- Christian Aid is developing a vaccine equity index targeting Sierra Leone, Kenya, Burundi, and Zimbabwe
 - Exploring barriers to access to vaccines
 - Hoping to mobilize masses to advocate for vaccine equity

Maaza will follow up with Robert (and hopefully connect with Suhayl Omar from PV Kenya) about the Africa Week of Action.
