Introduction of new members	Barrack announced the new membership organizations: REMI East Africa - Uganda Visual Aided Stories (VAS) - Tanzania, Freedom in Harmony – Uganda GOSANET Foundation - Ghana VOSIEDA - Liberia Action Share the list of these new CSOs with the Coordinator at People's Vaccine Alliance (PVA) Global so that they can be included in the group. Updates from around the continent	 Uganda is at 56% of immunization Covid-19 Vaccination at round three of the vaccination campaigns completed with round four underway there is some strategy on the vaccination of children from 12 to 17 years of age with an emphasis on the Johnson and Johnson vaccine that is expiring on December 2022 through the mopup campaigns in rural and urban areas by the Ugandan Ministry of health. (Rose Mary) Covid-19 testing has been minimized since it is not a requirement unless one is traveling and considering that it comes at a cost of about \$40 which a large population cannot access. (Rose Mary) The Monkey Pox status in DR Congo cannot be authoritatively reported but on the flip side vaccination of Covid-19 is very slow due to the conflicts in the East of the DR of Congo thus affecting also the West part of Uganda bordering the Country. Other reasons for the poor vaccine uptake are the conspiracy theories about the vaccines, minimal DR Congo Government support, and lack of information among the communities. (Kavengo) There should be a lot of advocacy on the vaccines by doing door-to-door mobilization talking to people and addressing their fears and reasons around the vaccination. (Vassie) Only 13% of the healthcare workforce has been vaccinated, there is need to find measures on how increase these numbers. There is a massive expiration of vaccines thus there should be the production of vaccines with a longer shelf life. There should be timely advocacy when vaccines get back to stock after massive stockouts. (Rose Mary) Governments should do their mandate of mobilizing their citizens with the assistance of CSOs and NGOs by practicing the best practices from other countries like Mauritius on the Covid-19 interventions. (Kavengo)
PVA Africa Highlights (COVID- 19 Advocacy Support Grants)	 The COVID-19 Advocacy Support Grants attracted 178 applications out of which 5 organizations were shortlisted after the screening process. These shortlisted subgrantees are undergoing the Due Diligence process before they embark on their projects. (Barrack) A meeting will be convened to introduce the 5 shortlisted sub-grantees and then publish their names on the African Alliance website and Social Media platforms and also shared with the PVA Global. (Barrack)
Update on the ongoing PVA Global new strategy development	There is need to revise the previous strategy which was previously based on trips waiver to reflect other emerging issues. Regional representatives are working on the respective drafts which will be finalized and shared with the PVA Global so that these priorities are included in the PVA Global strategy. (Barrack)
